Members of the Yellow Jacket Family:

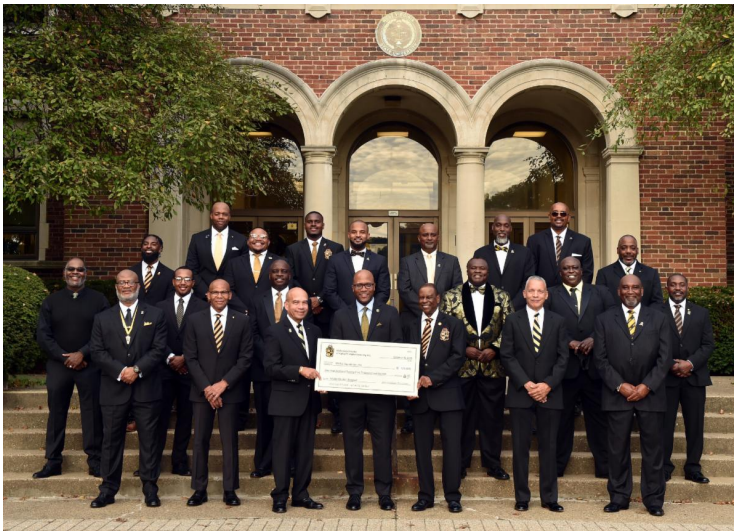
