THE NEWS AROUND STATE...

As WVSU bid farewell to Dr. Anthony Jenkins, we welcomed one of our own to temporarily stand in the gap. Dr. R. Charles Byers, Class of 1968, took the helm and held the ship steady until a successor was chosen. He has been a very loyal, dependable, and essential source of knowledge and stability as State has transitioned through multiple administrations. Dr. Byers is steady in his leadership, and has said that he will help wherever he is needed and will stay as long as necessary. In this interim period as we navigate these health and social issues, Dr. Byers has established a new Office of Diversity and Inclusion at State. His hopes are to address the problems we are facing as a society, and to equip students with the knowledge to deal with issues as they arise in their lives. As you may recall, in 2003, West Virginia State University, (then College) officially became a host institution for a Freedom Station on the National Underground Railroad program. With that designation, WVSU's mission is to educate the public about the global context of slavery and the historic struggle in West Virginia to abolish human enslavement, secure freedom and equal rights for people of all cultures, and promote dialogue in the ongoing struggle. From our first President, Dr. Byrd Prillerman, who was recommended by Booker T. Washington, to our interim President, Dr. R. Charles Byers, West Virginia State University stands as a "living laboratory of human relations" blending a diverse population of students, faculty and staff together to promote education and the betterment and understanding of the human race and condition.

Dr. Byers is also looking to name the IREB Building after past President Dr. Hazo Carter. He has cited many achievements by Dr. Carter and his wife, who expanded our footprint in Kanawha Valley in Agriculture, Research, and Teaching. Dr. Carter lead the 12-year quest to regain the institution's 1890 land grant status and secured other state funding as well. Following a resolution from our National Alumni Association in 2000, he provided the leadership that resulted in West Virginia State College being designated as West Virginia State University on April 7, 2004.

There has been a rumor circulating that State is closing. THAT IS INCORRECT!!! In this pandemic, enrollment may be a concern. However, there are remedies and instruments available to help as we move through these COVID-19 times. Stay tuned and keep believing in and supporting our alma mater! We have weathered many storms in our past and remained standing tall and getting better. Go State!

The Far West Region is proud to announce the Opal Carter Far West Region Scholarship. This scholarship was named after the illustrious matriarch of our region. Opal has received many awards for her contributions to her school, workplaces, and the communities that she served. She is the last living of the seven signers of the Agreement of Incorporation for the West Virginia State University National Alumni Association, which is on file at the Capital Building in Charleston. Opal is from the class of 1947 and was the 3rd grade teacher of Dr. Charles Byers. The Alumni Archives in the Erickson Alumni Building was named in her honor thanks to a generous financial contribution from the late Dr. Samuel Lynch, a former student and cheerleader for WVSU.



How to Donate to State for Homecoming 2020

Click the link in the email, or go to <u>https://www.wvstateu.edu/</u> and click on the Alumni tab. In the gold banner at the top of the page, click **Donate Now: Homecoming 2020**. You'll see a black page showing a progress bar for the Participation Drive.



Below that, you'll see more information, including a message from Belinda Fuller and Dr. Lateef Saffore, as well as a Donor Wall that shows names of donors and the states they represent.



When you click the gold Give Now button (on the black part of the screen), you will be taken to a page that shows the giving levels and perks, along with frequently asked questions. Once selected, you will fill in your contact information, billing address, and t-shirt size (for donations of \$150 or more). If you would prefer to send a check instead, complete the form on the next page and mail it to the school.
